



Water Safety Membership Renewal Instructions

This instruction is for parents/carers who are current members of Coogee SLSC and wish to:

Be involved in Minnows as Water Safety

Important Notice

Minnows parents have been granted the option this season of being either a General Member of the club (with very few membership rights) or an Active Senior Member of the Club (with full membership rights, for example, to use the club change rooms, compete for the club, and join the gym).

In order to obtain Active Senior Member status as a Minnows parent, you will have to register as an active senior member of the club and complete roughly 35 hours of patrols. While this might seem like a lot, you will find that you obtain the required number of hours in circumstances where you provide water safety for most of your child's Minnows sessions during the season (that is, 13-14 Sunday mornings of 2.5 hours each). You will be required to sign in to the patrol log book to qualify for these hours.

After 10 seasons (the life of your Nipper going through), if you have completed a full season of patrolling, you will be eligible for long service membership.

- ***No matter what type of registration you have*** All Water Safety must pass the current season's proficiency evaluation. These are held by Coogee SLSC. See <http://coogeefclub.com.au/> for details and dates.

Last year you should already have created a registration in the SLSA Portal. All you need to do now is renew and pay.

If you want to join the Minnows Patrol, please follow these instructions to renew and pay as an ACTIVE MEMBER:

Membership Renewal and Payment

1) Check your membership type.

Select “**Memberships**” from the **Life Saving Online** Menu. Select “**Active**”.

- **ONLY WATER SAFTEY WHO DO BELONG TO THE MINNOWS PATROL WITH COOGEE SLSC are “Active” members of Coogee SLSC**

2) Pay online:

- All applicants should complete as many of the personal information fields as possible.
- Accept the declaration and check all boxes for membership then click **Submit**.



Alternatively, if you would like to do Water Safety but you do not wish to be a part of the Minnow Patrol, you will need to register as a “General Member”. Please follow these instructions:

1) Membership Renewal

Select “Memberships” from the **Life Saving Online** Menu.

- Please note that General Members should not pay through this SLSA website. **DO NOT** select the link to pay online - payments are not made through this site.
- Please check the membership category.
- **WATER SAFETY WHO DO NOT DO REGULAR PATROLS WITH COOGEE SLSC - You are “General” members of Coogee SLSC**
- All applicants should complete as many of the personal information fields as possible.
- Accept the declaration and check all boxes for membership then click **Submit**.
- The account is now in a “**Pending**” status and will remain so until full payment is made
- The activation process can take a few days. You can check the status of your account by logging into **the SLSA Portal** - Go to portal.sls.com.au.
